



### A message from Mrs Foston...

# Reception Intake

### Reading

Over half term, all children are invited to take part in our 'book in a box' competition run by our reading ambassadors. All children will have a copy of the competition details attached to their homework this half term. We look forward to seeing all your amazing entries!





#### **41 Phonics Check**

The phonics screening check will be administered during the week beginning the 9<sup>th</sup> June. Children will be reading 40 words, 20 real words and 20 'alien' words. To prepare for this, please read with your children as much as possible and encourage them to use their Read Write Inc techniques 'Special Friends, Fred Talk, Read the Word.' Class teachers will be able to tell you if there are any sounds your child needs support with, they will also be sending all children home with some phonics practice sheets with QR codes to practice over half term.

### Multiplication Tables Check

The Year 4's will soon be taking the Multiplication Check which takes place over a two-week period starting on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> June. The test takes approximately 15 minutes, and the children will have opportunities to practise beforehand. To allow your child to do the best that they can, the soundcheck game on TTRS gives the children an idea of how the MTC is going to work and gives them a chance to practise.



# Nursery

Our new provision is due to open 8th September 2025 with building work commencing at the end of the summer term. We are delighted to have appointed Kayleigh Timings, a member of our nursery team at St Gilbert's as Nursery Manager. ## Statutory Assessments

Year 6 have completed their SATs and we congratulate and thank them for their incredible hard work and efforts. Year 6 will now focus upon their teacher assessed writing, further consolidation of learning and transition in addition to their many exciting activities which are planned next term.



### Sports

We have taken part in many different development days over the last month and the children have been brilliant at them all. First, our children enjoyed a basketball development day where the children were shown a range of different skills and had the opportunity to compete in matches against other schools. The children's behaviour and engagement in the day was amazing.

Our next development day was focussed on tennis where again the children were given the opportunity to develop their tennis skills focussing on hitting and returning the ball to their partners. The children enjoyed the event and their attitude whilst there was brilliant.

Over the next couple of months there are several competitions for our children to take part in including a tri-golf competition, capture the castle and a Dynamos cricket competition.

#### School Council

This term, we have introduced Social Impact Awards as part of a new program 'Superkind'. This is going to encourage children to complete actions which benefit either themselves or their community. School Council will be taking a lead on this and will be giving out stickers (which will act as their Superkind badges) in assemblies to those who have completed social actions. We are very excited about this new program in school and the impact it will have on our wellbeing and our community.

School Council also organised another bake sale using the cakes which were donated for VE Day and we raised our highest amount yet!



### VE Day

On Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> May, we celebrated VE Day by starting the day with an assembly. This was the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of VE Day – signalling eight decades since the end of the Second World War in Europe. Each year group sang a song and then enjoyed activities within their classrooms, making flags in Key Stage 1, whilst Key Stage 2 wrote a newspaper article. Lots of prizes were handed out. We enjoyed a picnic lunch altogether and continued to listen to war time songs. The day came to an end with a cake sale led by our school council. We raised £78 for the school, thank you for the contributions of cakes and sales.
