

### Trains, Planes and Automobiles

<b>Main Subject Focus</b> History	<b>Intent: Why?</b> This unit looks at developments of travel throughout history. Children develop an understanding and appreciation of how these developments have impacted upon our society today.	<b>Links to prior and wider learning</b> Builds upon earlier work focusing upon key events and people in history. Link to further study of space travel. <i>Voyagers, Read All about It! Castles, Crowns and Coronations, Out of this World</i>												
<b>Knowledge</b> Pupils will learn about: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• changes within living memory. Where appropriate, these should be used to reveal aspects of change in national life.</li><li>• events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally [for example, the first aeroplane flight]</li><li>• the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements. Some should be used to compare aspects of life in different periods [for example, Neil Armstrong]</li></ul>
