



What is the Early Years Foundation Stage?

 The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.

 It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning.

In the EYFS there are specific areas that we must cover in our curriculum.

The Prime Areas

- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The Specific Areas

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

There are three characteristics of effective learning that are taken into account when we plan and guide children's activities.

1. Playing and exploring

2. Active learning

3. Creating and thinking critically

Topics

- We are currently in the process of redesigning our curriculum to provide continuity and depth for children as they move from Reception into Key Stage 1.
- Some examples of previous topics are:
 - Jurassic adventure
 - Out of Africa
 - Pole to Pole
 - Ticket to Ride

Forest School


The children will get the chance to enjoy Forest School sessions in our school grounds.

The first few weeks

We will be carrying out assessments to find out what the children already know and can do and will then use this information to help us develop an individual learning programme for each child.

We will be using 'Tapestry' to record 'Wow!' moments and you will be able to access these from your mobile or a laptop once you have been signed up. We want to spend as much time as possible interacting with the children rather than taking photos all

The first few weeks

- All the children will start full time from Thursday 4th September
- On a P.E day the children come to school in their P.E kit and stay in it all day
- There is the option to bring their own packed lunch or have a free school dinner. The school dinners are provided by Willoughby Foods and they are lovely. We often find that children will try things that they haven't tried before. If your child has a packed lunch from home please don't pack too much
- Free fruit is provided at playtime and milk after playtime
