Intent: To learn about journeys and different places around the world.

#### **Key Texts**

### **Communication and Language**

Communication and Language underpins all learning and as such will be a focus throughout the provision. Daily activities will be planned focusing on: listening skills, conversation skills, attention, questioning and extending language.

#### **Literacy – Recounts and Instructions**

Children will:

- Sing and explore a range of traditional nursery rhymes and songs, building their knowledge of vocabulary.
- Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about non-fiction texts, rhymes and poems
- Read and write simple words, phrases and sentences for a variety of purposes including recounts, fact files, riddles and stories.
- Re-read books to increase fluency in reading

#### Maths

Children will learn to:

- Double and share
- Find odd and even numbers
- Visualise and build
- Investigate patterns
- Use spatial reasoning and mapping skills

This will be achieved through adult inputs, adult guided activities and opportunities provided through continuous provision to embed and apply skills taught.



### **Physical Development**

Daily planned activities to develop fine motor skills such as: Using small tools, paintbrushes, threading, tweezers. This will work towards holding a pencil with the correct grip. Gross motor activities will take place through the outside provision and weekly PE sessions. This will involve being able to demonstrate strength, balance and coordination through playing whilst negotiating space.

## Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will: Begin to build relationships with their peers and adults, gain an understanding of the daily classroom routine, recognising boundaries and understanding the feelings of themselves and others. They will be able to show awareness of rules and explain them. Children will explore the meaning of family and discuss differences and similarities.

### **Expressive Art and Design**

Children will explore a variety of tools, materials and techniques. This will include being able to mix colours to create others. Children will have the opportunity to talk about their creations, explaining the processes used. They will sing a wide range of songs and have the opportunity to perform these for others. They will begin to try to move in time with music.

### **Understanding the World**

Children will understand the effects of changing seasons on the natural world. They will continue to investigate characteristics and uses of different materials. Children will compare localities when exploring journeys around the world, identifying and discussing features of landscapes and animals that live there.
