English

In English, we will be improving our grammar, language and ability to write for different purposes through our topic. Some of the exciting writing opportunities this term includes looking at playscripts and creating our own myths and legends based on Egyptian and Mayan culture. We will also be developing our persuasive writing skills further by debating key issues. Our new class book will be 'The Secrets of a Sun King' by Emma Caroll. This is an exciting books about the adventures of the Egyptian desert.

Reading for pleasure and enjoyment will lie at the heart of our English curriculum. Children will be involved in guided reading, using a wide range of texts, linked to topic and our school reading spine. They will take part in group discussions and will be encouraged to share their own views and reading interests. Through discussion

and questioning comprehension skills will be developed, enabling children to increase understanding and appreciation of literature. Children are actively encouraged to continue reading at home and we look forward to seeing some new readers of the week this term.



Maths

Maths will be taught as an individual subject and will continue to adhere to the curriculum objectives. Teaching will enable children to become fluent in arithmetic as well as being able to reason and problem solve. Maths lessons will cover all aspects including, understanding number, using all four operations, measurement, geometry and statistics. Pupils will be extended at every opportunity to ensure their potential as mathematicians is achieved. Next term we will be focussing on shape, measure and problem solving.
