#### **Attendance and Punctuality**

Attendance at school is vitally important to ensure that all children make good progress and that they access the curriculum they are entitled to. In the first instance, it is the responsibility of pupils and their parents to ensure attendance at school as required by law. The Government states that an attendance rate of less than 95% will have a detrimental effect on a child's education. It is therefore the school's aim that each of our pupils should have an

attendance rate as high as possible; this being in excess of 95% each academic year unless there are exceptional circumstances, out of the child's control, that affect their attendance at school. If this is the case, the school will support the child and their family to ensure their attendance rate is as high as it can possibly be.



Lateness is hugely disruptive both to the child and to the effective running of the school and teaching. **The school day begins promptly at 8.55am**. Please make sure your children are at school by this time.
