Legal implications of being late to school

If children arrive after registration has closed, 9.25am, this will give them an unauthorised mark, this is a 'u' code.

A 'U' code is given as the child wasn't present at the time of registration - they were absent.

Schools will actively discourage lateness and be alert to patterns of late arrival and will act as appropriate.

Legal action can be taken against parents regarding unauthorised absence marks (e.g u code). It is therefore encouraged that parents ensure their child is on time.

Being late adds up

This chart shows how being late each day adds up with minutes equalling learning days lost.

| 5 minutes late each day | 3 days lost |
|--------------------------|---------------|
| 10 minutes late each day | 6.5 days lost |
| 15 minutes late each day | 10 days lost |
| 20 minutes late each day | 13 days lost |
| 30 minutes late each day | 19 days lost |




Come along to our coffee afternoon, enjoy a chat and meet other parents. This is a great opportunity to share experiences and offer support.




