Interventions on offer at our school

ELSA Emotional Literacy Support Assistants (A trained Teaching Assistant) support children 1:1 to improve mental health.	Lego Therapy Used to support children's mental health, turn taking and speech and language skills.	Gilly A programme aimed at building children's self- esteem and resilience. Fun activities to help improve their confidence and build new friendships. A 6-week programme.	Elklan This intervention is for children with a short attention span and struggles to focus. It is also a useful intervention for children who struggle to communicate verbally.
Multi-Sensory Room This room is specially designed for a therapeutic space that soothes and stimulates senses in a controlled manner. It offers a safe space for relaxation, exploration, independence, and social sessions.	Nessy A programme to support children with dyslexic tendencies.	Socially Speaking/ Time to Talk A programme that gives children the opportunity to learn and practice social skills, which help them develop and maintain positive relationships.	Sensory Circuits A sensory circuit is a form of sensory integration intervention. It involves a sequence of physical activities that are designed to alert, organise and calm the child. The sensory circuit aims to facilitate sensory processing to help children regulate and organise their senses in order to achieve the 'just right' or optimum level of alertness required for effective learning.
