Our key text will be 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell which is a fascinating class book that the children will all enjoy, and it is one of our favourites!




English

In English, we will be improving our grammar, language and ability to write for different purposes through our topic. Some of the exciting writing opportunities this term includes looking at poetic form and an author study. We will also be developing our discursive writing skills further by discussing the issues surrounding deforestation and care of the rainforest.

Reading for pleasure and enjoyment will lie at the heart of our English curriculum. Children will be involved in guided reading, using a wide range of texts, linked to topic and our school reading spine. They will take part in group discussions and will be encouraged to share their own views and reading interests. Through discussion and questioning comprehension skills will be developed, enabling children to increase understanding and appreciation of literature. Children are actively encouraged to continue reading at home and we look forward to seeing some new readers of the week this term.

Opportunities within all areas of the curriculum will be made available for children to develop their spoken language through discussion, drama and presentations.



Maths

Maths will be taught as an individual subject and will continue to adhere to the curriculum objectives. Teaching will enable children to become fluent in arithmetic as well as being able to reason and problem solve. Maths lessons will cover all aspects including, understanding number, using all four operations, measurement, geometry and statistics. Pupils will be extended at every opportunity to ensure their potential as mathematicians is achieved. Next term we will be focussing on fractions, decimals, percentages and converting units.
